## Meeting Notes:

- Welcome and Overview (Lynn)
  - Working towards better understanding snowbands and creating more accurate models to predict snowstorms
  - Apply observations to goals: improve remote sensing from space, improve modeling of snowfall
  - Haven't had a major study of snowstorms in the last 30 years
  - o Aircraft: ER-2/P-3
  - Need to identify criteria for which storms to monitor and observe
    - Look at stages of storm development, can you sample a storm during two different days?
    - Observe storms both over the ocean and over the land
  - Flight tracks & coordination of aircraft
  - Where do mobile groups need to be based? Driving to the midwest might be very cost intensive
    - Need to look at deploying and moving during winter weather could be very dangerous or impossible
  - Staffing/scheduling -- need to identify who is doing what and when (need a spreadsheet)
  - o In field data management and real-time data downlinking
  - Data products and archival timeline
  - Partners and parallel projects
  - Risks to IMPACTS (weather, instrument issues, fly-decisions)
    - Identify what the no-fly would be due to instrumentation
  - Science descopes cost management
  - Everyone should come ready to discuss these questions

- Budgets (Lynn)
  - Purpose for budget requests
    - We need to finalize the total budget before the ICR
  - Travel vs. General Needs
    - Separate travel from your general science budget
    - Some scientists have costs associated with mobile instruments that are tied to a university. This is distinct from personal travel reimbursement (hotels, food, airfare, etc.). We will go over these differences to ensure everyone has the correct items in the correct budget categories
  - Project Timeline & Integration
    - Reminder of our deployment timelines to ensure travel budgets are accurate (see slides)
    - Do you need to budget travel for integration? If so, have you included that time in your travel budget?
    - Integration time start as early as November
      - Integration starts as early as November but grants are budgeted in a fiscal calendar year. Sometimes we need to update your budgets for each year to account for the correct fiscal year
  - o Calendar
    - Second Science Meeting in October focus on the deployment
    - 6 week deployment in January February
    - Date for integration came from the airborne science website, they can be adjusted a little bit but that is what the aircraft have allocated so far
